
S-Cubed's Statement about Graduation Celebrations on Campus

The Science Students' Society (S-Cubed) is deeply disappointed about the recent acts of violence which ensued at the University yesterday afternoon and S-Cubed strongly condemns any behaviour which led to the injury of a member of staff from the Faculty of Science.

Although the society appreciates the unique occasion for celebration graduation offers, S-Cubed feels that any partying which negatively affects the reputation of students and harms the respectability of an institution such as the University of Malta is unacceptable. It also feels that any noisy conduct by graduates may be disrupting to students (some of which were actually undertaking a class test at the time of the incident) and is also unfair and distasteful when carried out excessively.

This is not the first time similar incidents have occurred at the faculty of science, all brought about by a lack of moderation in the graduation festivities. For this reason, the Science Students' Society would like to extend an appeal to graduating BSc. students to celebrate proportionately and respectfully towards other students, university staff, as well as the faculty premises.
